Programmes Summary



Pathways to Professions

Three programmes in one (for primary, secondary and sixth form students). Accumulated of ten specialised career workshops which are dedicated to inspiring students of a diverse ethnic heritage to follow their career aspirations whatever they may be. Key features:

- access to inspiring and relatable professionals providing an insight into different careers
- how their current stage of education links to ensuring professional success, broadening knowledge of the skills required in workplaces of the future.

Entrepreneurship and Innovation

Aimed at budding industry professionals either looking to grow their business or take their ideas to the next stage. Five weeks of workshops led by professional experts who guide participants through every stage of creating a business, from marketing and PR to mastering financial forecasting. Following 'The Big Pitch', our winners walk away with a £2,300 Innovation Award to put towards their business idea.

Building Futures: At-Risk

A series of workshops and career resources for secondary school students who are at risk of educational failure or exclusion, all of diverse ethnic heritages and/or at a socioeconomic disadvantage. This programme provides them with personal development opportunities, access to professionals and insights to help them navigate to future success.

Building Futures: Built Environment

Only 1.2% of architects are Black with only 0.7% of that group being Black women. Building Futures has been designed to reshape this narrative, supporting young people who are on their journey into the Built Environment sector. We work with 50+ architecture practices who provide specialist support such as career talks, design and skills workshops, mentoring, employment opportunities and bursaries.

Transitions to Employment

Motivating and empowering Year 12 students within London through providing personal and professional development to prepare for their transition to employment. Nine engaging workshops, from workplace visits to CV and interview preparation, to talks from industry professionals – we aim to inspire young people within and beyond the classroom.

With the support of our partners, we provide financial support to students across the UK. This support is provided to students for the duration of their degrees since financial hardship does not simply disappear after year one. Students receives £2,250 yearly to put towards costs such as: maintenance, travel, books, printing and field trips. They also receive additional advice and guidance to support their personal and professional development through 1:1 mentoring and regular events and workshops.

Financial Services Pathway

For those aged 18-30 who are interested in the financial services sector, this programme provides young people with virtual skills-based workshops, 1:1 mentoring and workplace visits with leading financial institutions. Participants will build their network, grow their confidence and develop professional transferable skills to increase their employability prospects.

Community Leadership Academy

A bespoke training programme designed specifically for community leaders who are a part of small or microorganisations that are led by or support those of diverse ethnic backgrounds. Participants receive:

- monthly leadership and management masterclasses
- monthly peer group mentoring
- learning resources
- network expanding opportunities
- certificate of completion for LinkedIn.

Supporting Communiti

Our research has shown that sexual health services do not currently meet the expressed or unexpected needs of communities. Subsequently Blueprint for All partnered with national sexual health charity Brook and social impact communications agency Shape History to challenge inequalities in access to provision of sexual health services for ethnically diverse communities in Lambeth, Southwark, and Lewisham. This project aims to deliver high quality and culturally sensitive sexual and reproductive health services and education.



Connecting People and Places

Connecting People and Places is a two-phase project highlighting the histories and places of importance to people from diverse backgrounds. Phase 1 of the project was designed to increase recognition of how migrant and minority ethnic communities have influenced heritage across England and contributed to Historic England's work, to enrich understanding of the buildings and places that are important to our national history. The second phase shares the findings as a travelling (digital) exhibition, a podcast, and culminates in a third phase as a book publication.
