| Government Support | <u>Adult Dependants' Grant</u> | To be eligible: If you're a full-time student in higher education and an adult depends on you financially |
| Wider grants | <u>Cash for Kids</u> | Our grants are only for children under the age of 18 living in the UK, The value of a grant is typically from £1,000 to £3,000. |
| Government Support | <u>Childcare Grant</u> | To be eligible: are a full-time higher education student have children under 15, or under 17 if they have special educational needs |
| Course Specific Support | <u>Dance and Drama Awards</u> | Dance and Drama Award (DaDA) to help with fees and living costs at one of 16 private dance and drama schools. For UK students aged 16 to 23 |
| Government Support | <u>Disabled Students' Allowance (DSA)</u> | You can apply for Disabled Students' Allowance (DSA) if you live in England and have a disability that affects your ability to study |
| Government Support | <u>Further education courses and funding</u> | Further education (FE) includes any study after secondary education that's not part of higher education (that is, not taken as part of an undergraduate or graduate degree). Courses range from basic English and maths to Higher National Diplomas (HNDs). |
| Maintenance Grants | <u>Home Student Finance Wales</u> | Student finance in Wales, also additional support via Disabled Students' Allowance (DSA) |
| Course Specific Support | https://www.cherubimtrust.org/ | Providing professional quality instruments on loan to students aged 15-25 who cannot afford one that matches their ability. |
| Wider grants | <u>Lawrence Atwell Charity</u> | Grants from £100 to £1,500 for people aged 16 to 26, to take courses (up to level 3) that will help them move into employment. Funding can be given for course fees, equipment/materials, travel costs and childcare. |
| Government Support | <u>Learner Support: Overview</u> | If you're aged 19 or over, on a further education course, Learner Support can help pay for things you need to attend your course or study that are not covered by your course fees. |
| Course Specific Support | <u>NHS bursaries</u> | If you're an eligible full-time NHS student, you can apply for: a bursary from the NHS, a £1,000 grant from the NHS, a reduced Maintenance Loan from Student Finance England |
| Government Support | <u>Parents' Learning Allowance</u> | To be eligible for help with your learning costs if you're a full-time student with children. |
| Wider grants | <u>Cash for Kids</u> - | Our grants are only for children under the age of 18 living in the UK, The value of a grant is typically from £1,000 to £3,000. |

| Government Support | <u>Childcare Grant</u> | To be eligible: are a full-time higher education student have children under 15, or under 17 if they have special educational needs |
| Course Specific Support | <u>Savoy Educational Trust</u> | Purpose is to advance and develop education, training and qualifications within the hospitality industry. |
| Wider grants | <u>ScotsCare</u> | Student & training grants available to first and second generation Scottish people living within a 35 mile radius of Charing Cross in London. Do not consider funding for postgraduate or online courses |
| Wider grants | <u>Sir William Boremans Foundation</u> | Full or part-time students under the age of 25 who live either in the London boroughs of Greenwich or Lewisham. Grants are to cover living expenses that will allow individuals to continue their education or training. |
| Course Specific Support | <u>Social work bursaries</u> | For eligible social work students who: don't get funding from their employer are studying an approved undergraduate or postgraduate course in social work don't already have a higher education social work qualification |
| Maintenance Grants | <u>Student Awards Agency Scotland</u> | Targeted to higher education students find the right information, support and funding in Scotland. |
| Government Support | <u>Student finance for undergraduates</u> | Borrow money to help pay for university or college tuition fees and to help with living costs. |
| Maintenance Grants | <u>Student Loans nidirect</u> | These are need-based grants to support students from low socio-economic backgrounds. |
| Course Specific Support | <u>Talented Athlete Scholarship Programme</u> | TASS helps athletes - aged 16-plus - to balance sport within the rest of their lives, be they in education, training or another form of personal development. For England and Wales based students |
| Course Specific Support | <u>Teacher training funding</u> | Undergraduates and postgraduates can get help with the costs of their teacher training. |
| Wider grants | <u>The Bright Side of Life</u> | To relieve the needs of children (under 18 year olds) by reason of finance, illness, or other disadvantage, by the provision of grants to improve their conditions of life. England and Wales only. |
| Wider grants | <u>The Emmott Foundation Limited</u> | Grants available to students studying A levels in fee-paying schools (including state boarding schools). Applicants must need financial assistance because of a sudden or unexpected family crisis such as death, accident, severe illness, divorce, desertion or loss of employment. Email The Emmott Foundation Limited to request an application form. |
| Wider grants | <u>The Hilda Martindale Trust</u> | The Hilda Martindale Trust makes a very limited number of awards to British women who are training or studying for a career in a profession where women are under-represented. The maximum award is £3,000. |
| Wider grants | <u>The Princes Trust</u> | Development Awards can cover the cost of course fees, tools or equipment for a new job. |
| Government Support | <u>Universal Credit</u> | Universal Credit is a payment to help with your living costs. It's paid monthly - or twice a month for some people in Scotland. |
| Course Specific Support | <u>Winning Students</u> | Sports scholarships for Scotland based full-time and part-time students at college or university. |
